K9s Serving Vets is a 501(c)(3) Veteran-founded nonprofit organization guiding Veterans to life-changing service dogs. We are focused on the journey of Veterans to find their service dogs and we act as a road map to help them navigate the process. We provide them with the requirements of the Department of Veterans Affairs to ensure they receive the additional benefits for Veteran service dog handlers, we help them find the right training organization for their needs, assist with fundraising for the costs and help them transition into their new life as a Veteran service dog handler.

While a service dog's purpose is to assist their handler with daily needs and tasks, at the core of a service dog partnership is the bond. K9s Serving Vets was founded to arm Veterans in search of service dogs with information, guidance, and support in order to partner with that K9 that will be their friend, ally, and companion.



K9s Serving Vets Service Dog Assistance Application Process

1. Submit a completed application along with \$25 Application Fee
2. Submit a copy of your DD214
3. Submit a letter from your primary care physician, psychiatrist, psychologist, or other licensed healthcare professional stating he/she believes a service dog would be beneficial for mitigating your service-connected disability.
4. Email a recent photo to info@k9sservingvets.org
5. Submit two personal references (not a relative) to K9s Serving Vets.
6. Initial each page next to the page number.

Dog food: approximately \$30-\$45/month; we will offer recommendations

Veterinary wellness visit (\$70), heartworm preventative given monthly (\$70, 6-pack), tick/flea preventative given monthly (\$70, 6-pack) and annual immunizations will be approximately \$300. Some veterinarians may offer a Service Dog/military discount.

Replacement equipment: including, but not limited to, packs, leashes, collars, vest, bowls, etc. will be approximately \$75/year.

Toys and treats will be approximately \$150/year.
